

For five weeks in Lent, we'll reflect on several great prayers from the Bible as we learn and grow together in faith. And this year we offer two options:

Wednesdays @ 10am In Person: We'll gather in Fellowship Hall for a study followed by a brief prayer service.

Thursdays @ 6:30 pm Online: We'll offer a 30 min. study on Zoom.



Weekly Themes

February 25/26: Hannah's Prayer for a child (1 Samuel 2:1-10) and Mary's Prayer (Luke 1:46-55). Faithful women pray for a new future, not just for themselves, but for everyone.

March 4/5: Solomon Prays for Wisdom (1 Kings 3:5-15). Praying for ourselves and for others.

March 11/12: Praising God in the Belly of a Fish (or anywhere) (Jonah 2:2-9). Jonah praises God within in the Belly of the Fish and God answers in surprising ways.

March 18/19: Paul Prays for Safe Travel (Romans 15:14-33). "You can't always get what you want. . ." But God does give us what we need.

March 25/26: Prayer 101 with Jesus (Matthew 6:6-15). Some basic lessons in prayer and the Lord's Prayer.
