## From The Pastor's Desk

#### Dear Friends,

One of the interesting dynamics in many churches is that people seem to think the church year ends with Easter. We had a wonderful series of services this year on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. But we continue in ministry and mission on a year-round basis.

True, there are not as many activities and events scheduled for May through August as in other parts of the year, and certainly not as many as we had during Lent. There is a part of me that really appreciates that! We do need to remember that Jesus was with the disciples for 40 days after his resurrection, and then 50 days after his resurrection was the day of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples and sent them forth into ministry in the larger world. Prior to Pentecost they were pretty much secluded, keeping to themselves, in part, because of the fear of what might happen to them if they were to go out preaching about Jesus. I think that time was also a time of learning, of Jesus explaining to them many of the things that took place in his ministry that the disciples hadn't understood at the time.

So I encourage you to continue to be involved in the life and ministry and mission of Camp Hill Presbyterian Church. Yes, there is still transition taking place, and there will still be

## Presbyterian Women

- **Prayer Fellowship,** meeting at 9:30AM every Wednesday in the Reception Room, is led by the Reverend Myrtle McCall. Everyone is encouraged to attend.
- **Second Saturday** meets the second Saturday of every month at the Silver Spring Diner. All women of CHPC are invited for breakfast (each paying for her own) and fellowship. New participants are always welcome.
- **Quilters and Crafters** meets every Monday from 1:00 3:00PM in the Quilting Room off Fellowship Hall. New members are always welcome.
- The Dorcas Circle meets on the second Thursday of each month, September through May, at 10:00 AM in Fellowship Hall. Chaired by Gail Mark, Linda Kelley facilitates the Bible Study.
- **Personal Care Items for the Ecumenical Food Pantry** are collected year-round, with members of PW making delivery monthly.

# Learn

## **Exegesis**

The Exegesis class has been studying the Gospel of Mark this year. We read a group of verses, learn about the context of what was said or happened, discuss its meaning to us and our lives, and then move to the next group of verses. Each Sunday we pick up where we left off the week before. Some weeks we cover an entire chapter and other weeks only a few verses. You might think that you would have to have been with us from Mark 1:1 in order to participate and benefit from the class, but that is not the case. Each lesson stands on its own in many ways, just as a sermon based on selected verses from the Bible stands on its own.

The Exegesis Class was formed over twenty years ago by a group of members that wanted to learn more about the Bible. The name Exegesis was selected to describe what we wanted during the Sunday School hour – a detailed explanation of the text of the Bible. Rev. Anne Ross, before leaving to pursue a career in ministry, was our initial facilitator. Bill Stout currently facilitates the class.

As of this writing, we have arrived at the final week in the life of Jesus. There is much to be learned from these final chapters of Mark's Gospel. Please join us To interpret the Bible correctly is to humbly seek the Lord and listen to what the Holy Spirit Himself has breathed into the text—to find what the text itself is saying, and then draw the meaning *out of* the passage. (This is called *exegesis*— *Ex* is a Greek preposition meaning "out of.")
