Why Do We Sing What We Sing?

Worship Gospel Style

Traditional Black gospel music, said to have originated in the American south in the 1930s, combines Christian lyrics with a variety of musical forms including jazz, blues, ragtime, and bluegrass. Thomas A. Dorsey is known as “the father of gospel music.” He wrote 500 songs, including “Precious Lord Take My Hand.” Today, there are many different styles among the most notable: southern gospel music, Christian country music, and traditional black gospel music.

During this same period that experienced the Great Depression, storefront churches emerged in the poorest neighborhoods of cities across the country. They became centers for social development and community engagement. As they did then, today’s storefront churches have several elements in common. They provide a religious home for people in similar economic circumstances, and in doing so they create a sense of community and mutual responsibility and sharing. While these churches usually have a man or woman who is in charge, they tend to emphasize the role of the whole membership in congregational activities and worship. In this way they offer leadership roles to community members who might never have been able to achieve such positions otherwise. Through their enthusiastic forms of worship, storefront churches also provide a means of self-expression that offers a powerful emotional release.
