## MEET OUR GUEST PREACHER

Our guest preacher today is **Dr. Drew G. I. Hart**, assistant professor of theology at Messiah University, author, and activist.

Drew received his bachelor's degree in biblical studies from Messiah, his Master's of Divinity degree with an urban concentration from Biblical Seminary, and his Ph.D. in theology and ethics at Lutheran Theological Seminary, Philadelphia.

After his undergraduate studies, Drew spent most of his time pastoring and mentoring black and brown youth, working for an inner city after-school program, and working closely with Philadelphia-based nonprofits. Today, along with teaching theology, Drew continues to partner with community groups and churches across the country by facilitating anti-racism trainings and seminars, as well as delivering lectures and talks for colleges and conferences.

Drew brings together his pastoral experience with his academic training to challenge the Church on a variety of topics. He has been particularly invested in writing and speaking about white supremacy/racism and their entanglements with western Christianity, and also speaks and writes about Christian discipleship, western Christendom, Christian history, liberation and oppression, radical peacemaking and nonviolent resistance, urban ministry, social media, etc.

Drew has a Christian Century-hosted blog, "Taking Jesus Seriously," and a website, [www.drewgihart.com](http://www.drewgihart.com). He also is the author of "Trouble I've Seen: Changing the Way the Church Views Racism." He and his wife, Renee, have three sons and live in Harrisburg.

## IT'S HAPPENING AT CHPC

- Our participation in the initial two-year commitment to Thriving Together is drawing to a conclusion. Before extending our learning into congregational action, our Thriving Together cohort realized a need for the congregation to discern and/or clarify its own understanding of what it means to be “the beloved community.” **Next Sunday, Jan. 29, CHPC members are invited to, as part of our worship together, engage in compassionate dialogue on how we can more fully embody our call to be the beloved community, modeling the radical inclusive love of Christ.** Worship will not be livestreamed that day.

These items (or generic equivalents) are welcomed: Tussin (any variety); Vicks chest rub; Claritin; children’s Tylenol; vitamin C chewable, vitamin C booster, Emergen-C, or Airborne; no-touch forehead thermometers (infrared digital for adults or kids), T-shirts and underwear (any size – they have enough socks for the moment); and hand warmers (for preventing frostbite). Items can be placed in the boxes in the Gathering Place and outside the church office.
- **PW continues to collect new and gently used blankets for the Downtown Daily Bread Emergency Shelter.** Please place donations in the box labeled “Blankets” in the Gathering Place’s Donation Center.
