- \*Proclamation of the Resurrection (based on John 20)
- L: Easter begins in despair. Our life, our love, our hope forever dead, crushed by a boulder, bottled up in a cave.
- P: Who will roll away the stone?
- L: Easter takes us by surprise, early in the morning. The obstacles we face are removed. Where once death and despair laid locked in time, now the bright life of hope sprouts wings to fly from emptiness.
- P: It is, at first, too good to be true.
- L: When faced with a miracle, our first reflex is to run. Be not afraid, you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here. He is risen; see the place where they laid him.
