L: Blessed is the Lord our God, who has spoken through the prophets. .

P: **The Lord our God is holy!**

L: Blessed is the Lord our God, who came to us in Jesus Christ.

P: **The Lord our God is holy!**

L: The one who spoke and called light out of darkness now shines in our hearts.

P: **The Lord our God is holy!**

L: The one who comes and does not keep silence now speaks in our midst.

P: **The Lord our God is holy!**

L: Now we have seen the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

P: **The Lord our God is holy!**

L: Great God of dazzling beauty and overshadowing majesty, in Jesus Christ, your beloved, we glimpse in an image the fullness of your glory. Teach us to listen to him so that we may hear your voice and follow your holy way; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

*Call to Confession

Jesus said: Nothing is hidden that will not be disclosed, nor is anything secret that will not come to light. Trusting in God's grace, let us confess our sins, first in silence and then with one common voice. Let us pray.

*Prayer of Confession

God of compassion, in Jesus Christ you reveal the light of your glory, but we turn away, distracted by our own plans. We confess that we speak when we should listen, and act when we should wait. Scripture Reading

Luke 9:28-36

Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah" — not knowing what he said. While he was

saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.

Prayers of the People

L: Holy God Who Is One and Alone

PR: In the famished wilderness, in pillars of cloud by day and fire by night, you spoke to Moses.

PL: In a wilderness drought, through the suffering of a widow from Zarephath, you showed your holy power to Elijah.

PR: In giving your Moral Law in tablets of stone on Mount Horeb, you spoke to your people through Moses..

PL: In a showdown on Mount Carmel against the prophets of Baal, you showed your holy power to your people through Elijah.

PR: In a glimpse of the valleys of the Promised Land from Mount Nebo, your holy power remained with your people, even as Moses breathed his last.

PL: In a glimpse of ascending chariots of fire in the wilderness outside Jericho, you promised that you would again speak to your people in the prophet Elijah, announcing the coming of our Messiah and King.

L: Holy God in Three Persons,
Continue to speak to us, and through us. Return again to show your holy power to us, and through us.
Give us tongues of prophetic fire, and set our hearts ablaze, in Scripture through your Spirit who proceeds from Christ.

PL: Nourish us with manna from heaven and living water at this Table with Christ.

PR: Teach us through your Moral Law, which we are free to follow through Christ.

L: In your earthly church, we dare to ask you to speak and work through us. Join us to the person of Jesus that we might ask what our hearts desire, and receive it. And so we are bold to offer our prayers for those who need to hear your reconciling voice and glimpse your healing power.
