*Call to Confession

Psychologists tell us that it only takes a tenth of a second for us to form an impression of a stranger. In other words, it only takes a tenth of a second for us to look at someone's face and determine a stereotype about who they are. With decisions happening that quickly, it is not hard to imagine why we might need this moment of confession. The Prayer of Confession is an opportunity to slow down. We take that tenth of a second and give it room to breathe. We reflect on the decisions that we've made this past week, and we ask for God's mercy to be in all of them. And without fail, God redeems the cracks of our lives, and we are made better for it. With that confidence, let us go to God in prayer.
