The Hershey Handbell Ensemble was formed in 2004 and is based in south-central Pennsylvania. It was formed to fulfill the need for an auditioned community ensemble composed of persons able to play advanced literature and who are interested in advancing the art of handbell ringing through education and performance, while uniting people through the musical arts.

The 15-member group, under the direction of Dr. Shawn Gingrich, performs on seven and a half octaves of Malmark handbells, handchimes, and other instruments.
