According to the film's website, it explores "Christian nationalism, which is the belief that America should be defined as a Christian nation, with government adherence to this ideology. 'God & Country' takes a closer look at the dangerous implications and explores how a base of Christians has radically stoked a movement erasing the line between Church and State. 'God & Country' speaks directly to the almost 200 million Americans who identify as Christians: Christians who fear their faith is being hijacked by an extreme right wing political movement known as Christian nationalism." The film features many of today's most prominent and well-respected voices of Christianity.
